

## **Review of Other Jurisdictions**

### **Regina, SK**

Bylaw No. 9900, The Regina Traffic Bylaw states:

“No Parking

35. (4) No person shall park a vehicle on any:
- (c) area adjacent to a centre median or traffic island;”

### **Ottawa, ON**

By-law No. 2017-301 states:

“STOPPING PROHIBITED IN SPECIFIED PLACES – NO SIGNS

11. (2) No person shall stop a vehicle or permit a vehicle to remain stopped on any highway:
- (g) on any central boulevard or on any outer boulevard or adjacent to either side or the ends of any central boulevard or median strip, except when parking in these locations is otherwise permitted by this by-law;”

### **Toronto, ON**

Toronto Municipal Code Chapter 950, Traffic and Parking states:

“§ 950-400. General stopping and parking regulations.

- B. No person shall on any highway stop any vehicle:
- (9) On any middle boulevard or centre strip separating two roadways or adjacent to either side or ends of such middle boulevard or centre strip; except where such median or centre strip is located in a cul-de-sac and vehicles so parked do not interfere with the free flow of traffic;”

### **Vancouver, BC**

Bylaw No. 2849, The Street and Traffic By-law states:

“STOPPING AND PARKING - STREETS

- 17.2 An owner, registered owner, lessee or operator of a vehicle must not cause, allow or permit that vehicle to stop:
- (h) alongside a median, traffic island or traffic circle;”
