7. QUESTION PERIOD

7.1 Councillor T. Davies - Investment in Juno Awards - Cancellation

Councillor Davies noted the situation with the Grey Cup in Regina being cancelled and the returned investment back to Regina in 2022. He asked if the City of Saskatoon had been in contact with the organizers of the Juno's with respect to any return on investment due to the Juno's being cancelled.

General Manager, Community Services Lacroix indicated that the City is in conversations with the organizers and is due to report back to Council regarding the City's commitment to the Juno's likely in June or July of 2020.

7.2 Councillor D. Hill - Railroad Embankments - Urban Forestry

Councillor Hill inquired about the recent removal of trees on CP Rail's property.

General Manager, Community Services Lacroix indicated that the City did not receive advance notice of the removal of the trees and nor was there any requirement as it is private property.

As a follow up, Councillor Hill asked if Administration could work with CP Rail on the re-vegetation of the area. General Manager Lacroix noted the City could work with CP Rail on trees and vegetation that would thrive in our climate.

City Clerk Sproule indicated that the Administration is looking at the potential of an in-person Council meeting in June.
