No examples from Ontario were provided because Ontario opted for an initial lottery system that authorized only 25 stores ot open in the province in April 2019. Additional licenses were added later in 2019, but by mid-December, AGCO announced it would end the lottery system and remove the cap on retail licenses in favour of open market cannabis retail in 2020. Ontario does not currently provide a good example of open market retail.

Manitoba is also not used as an example because although it may become an open market in the future, it is not an open market at this time. The existing retail stores were established by parties that were successful in either a RFP or a Cannabis Retail Opportunity Draw.
