4.1.1 COVID-19 RESPONSE UPDATE

A report of the Chief Financial Officer was provided.

A letter submitting comments dated March 18, 2020 from Tamara Hinz was added to this item.

City Manager Jorgenson provided a verbal update on activities the City has been doing in response to COVID-19 highlighting upcoming changes to Transit operations, residential parking enforcement, closure of civic facilities, working with labour unions, and development of a work from home strategy. He assured that the City of Saskatoon is still open for business even though walk-in traffic has been limited.

General Manager, Community Services Lacroix updated that at the current time paid parking is continuing.

City Solicitor Yelland reported that under The City Administration Bylaw the City Manager has authority to make operational decisions about the City. Administration usually brings reports to Council for their input. However, during this time of emergency Administration is collapsing around the operational provisions in the Bylaw to allow the City Manager to make nimble decisions to protect the provision of core services.
