BACKGROUND

At its <u>September 28, 2020 Regular Business Meeting</u>, City Council considered the report of the General Manager, Community Services Department dated September 14, 2020 and resolved:

- That proposed amendments to Bylaw No. 7860, Animal Control Bylaw, 1999, as outlined in Option 1- Maximum of Four Dogs in Off-Leash Areas and Implementation of a Commercial Dog Walker Permit Process Allowing up to Eight Dogs at Approved Off-Leash Areas, and the implementation of a Commercial Dog Walking Permit process be approved; and
- 2. That the City Solicitor be requested to make the necessary amendments to Bylaw No. 7860, Animal Control Bylaw, 1999.

DISCUSSION/ANALYSIS

The Bylaw comes into force on January 1, 2021.
