



## COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT SUMMARY

Kensington Neighbourhood Concept Plan Amendment

**Applicant:** Saskatoon Land  
**File:** PL 4131 – 036 – 003

### Project Description

Saskatoon Land has applied to amend the Kensington Neighbourhood Concept Plan to accommodate a local road connection to provide improved access and connectivity between the north and south areas of Kensington and to the Core Park. The location of the proposed local road is currently a greenspace connection linking Nightingale Close to Bentley Place.

### Community Engagement Strategy

#### Form of Community Engagement Used:

Information Mailout – A notice detailing the proposed Concept Plan Map Amendment was mailed out to 81 property owners and the Ward Councillor in September 2020. The notice included details on the application, the proposed Concept Plan Map Amendment and timelines for application review. Contact information for City of Saskatoon (City) staff was included to solicit comments on the application.

#### Purpose:

To inform and consult – Mail out recipients were provided with an overview of the applicant's proposal and given the opportunity to ask questions and provide comments. Written comments (email/comment sheets) were accepted.

#### Level of Input or Decision Making Required from the Public:

Comments, concerns, and opinions were sought from the public.

#### Who was Involved:

- Internal stakeholders – The standard administrative review process was followed and relevant internal divisions of the City were contacted for review and comment. The Ward 3 Councillor was also advised of the application.

### Summary of Community Engagement Feedback

No questions or comments were received during the public notice period.
