

## Triple Bottom Line Review – Curbside Organics Program Collection Options

### Process and Methodology

The City of Saskatoon’s Triple Bottom Line (TBL) Decision Making Tool is used to compare options in accordance with *Council Policy C08-001 - Triple Bottom Line*.

For the purposes of the Curbside Organics Program Collections Options, a TBL approach could be used as part of a public procurement to evaluate an individual proposals’ environmental, social, economic, and governance outcomes, as well as to identify opportunities to achieve even greater sustainability benefits for the preferred proponent.

Several factors would be considered to ensure proposals are in alignment with the Triple Bottom Line policy and the results of the TBL assessment would be incorporated into the overall evaluation matrix to determine the preferred proponent.
