Re: (re)naming of McPherson Avenue

Dear Committee

I write concerning the proposal to rename McPherson Avenue, a topic which *The StarPhoenix* reports you will consider again at your next quarterly meeting. I should identify myself: I am a retired historian who lives at [REDACTED] 10<sup>th</sup> St. E., Saskatoon. I was a member of the History faculty of the University of Saskatchewan from 1970 to 2014, and I have remained active as an author and consultant since my retirement.

I write to ask you to read and consider an authoritative biography of Sir David Lewis Macpherson, for whom McPherson Avenue appears to be named, before making a decision on the request of Ms. Stephanie Danyluk to rename it because, she says, Macpherson was the author of some “egregious” policies. I should say that I do not know Ms. Danyluk personally, although I know of her from her days as a student in my former department. Her reputation was, and is, as a skilful and experienced historian. I do not wish in any way to impugn her professional reputation. I have not read her submission to your Committee.

I simply would like the Committee to consider another view of Macpherson before making a decision. To that end I attach a biography of Macpherson from volume twelve of *The Dictionary of Canadian Biography*, which is the best peer-reviewed source on Canadian political figures. The author of the Macpherson biography is Dr. Ken Cruikshank, a well known and respected historian of Canada.

The [attached biography](#) is rather long, for which length I apologize, but the parts that are most relevant to your mandate are found in the last few pages. I think it is worth reading despite its length because it is an in-depth account and assessment of Macpherson and the policies of the government of which he was a part that is based on detailed research. In other words, it is an account on which readers can rely.
