Narrative history

L103899 Trooper (6th Armoured Regiment, 1st Hussars) Edward Matheson Buller (b.1924) of Saskatoon was KIA 19450226 during operations to clear the west bank of the Rhine and is buried at Groesbeek Canadian war cemetery near Nijmegen, Gelderland, Netherlands. He was the son of James S. and Rosena D. Buller. James was a Cree teacher who became enfranchised in 1930. Edward was working as a warehouseman for CN when he enlisted at Regina early in 1943 (see Matheson Lake in Geographic Names of Saskatchewan for a likely derivation of his first names). His brother James served aboard HMCS New Waterford.


