I certainly understand what the city is trying to do, but I don't think these restrictions are logical and I don't believe that they will be effective. I don't understand how places of worship are allowed to have up to 150 people who have not had their proof of vaccination required (supposedly masked) but the council is looking at a bylaw where a household cannot have more than 2 vaccinated families?
