I am writing to tell you that I object to the proposed limitations on church gatherings and forcing people to show vaccination status to attend. People would be better served and loved by caring for each other's mental, emotional and spiritual health.

At this point, this virus is clearly out in the world. Locking down people in their homes will not prevent spread, only delay it perhaps. But it will cause anger and hatred and unrest in your city. I know you don't want that.

To now limit gatherings in churches looks pretty bad when compared with allowing a concert of 18,000 unmasked people at Eric Church on October 23rd. It could be construed as picking on one group of people more than another group of people. If there is an uptick in cases within the next week or two, it will not be because of churches gathering. If you want people to come out the other side of this pandemic, you must look for ways to help unite us, not divide and segregate. Everywhere we look on TV and even on radio there is segregation and hatred being spoken against people

who are only trying to navigate this to the best of their abilities too. Are we not all in this together? Please do not cause the people of Saskatoon to mistrust you by passing this bylaw.
