Re: Proposed Lane Closure between 201 20th Street W. and 309 Avenue B S.

Hello,

Upon reflecting, I have concerns regarding this planned lane closure, and they should be addressed before the final decision. My tenant's business occupies 20th Street W. and has concerns about receiving and delivering goods daily via large cargo vans and 53-foot trailer tractor units. With limited access to the back store creates havoc on Chung Wah Chinese Grocery's livelihood. Being limited to one-way access affects the nearby businesses, available parking for customers, and pedestrian traffic.

Furthermore, the potential closure of a portion of the alley brings increased risk to public safety. With the nature of the neighbourhood and community demographic, I am concerned about the likelihood of increased crime and violence such as physical and sexual assaults. As emergency personnel respond to such public safety concerns, one-way access limits emergency vehicle entry. During wintertime especially, limited street access leads to issues with snow clearance. Riversdale is the heart of Saskatoon. It is a neighbourhood undergoing significant upgrades such as street maintenance and water main systems. Considering these upgrades and the uptick in traffic with one-way access inconveniences nearby businesses and the risk of accidents.

As the proprietor of two buildings, I am concerned about the realities of my rental properties. With potential challenges with Chung Wah Chinese Grocery's nature, I am worried about decreased property and market values, monthly rental rates, and ceased lease renewals.

I have had ties to Riversdale since I was a child. I am proud of Riverdale's positive transformation into a thriving neighbourhood. With the uptick in local businesses and families settling in our community, I would hate to step backwards in our progress.

Thanks for your time and consideration. I hope you recognize the domino effect on my property and the surrounding businesses within our community.
