
The students and staff at Bethlehem Catholic High School would like to take steps to deal with all the disposable masks in and around our building. We hope to divert them from the landfill and thus we are requesting your assistance.

As a UNESCO School, we are called to live sustainably and peacefully. As a Catholic school, we believe that our faith calls us to be stewards of the Earth by using resources wisely, keeping our environment clean, and preserving the environment for future generations. We would like to recycle our disposable masks. Through research of various possibilities, we have found only one viable Canadian option (which is currently being used on the U of S campus): a company called TerraCycle. We hope to purchase the company's ZeroWaste box (to collect and mail the waste) for a price of \$250. Before we started collecting masks at the exits, we estimated that one of these boxes would serve to contain one month of masks. Our 8-day pilot project has shown that this is a serious under-estimate; we will need a ZeroWaste box every two weeks. If we continue to wear masks for the rest of the school year, \$4000 is far beyond our club budget. After consulting our school administration and putting in a request at the school division level, we are unable to fully fund this project on our own.

In effect, we are asking if the City of Saskatoon has the will and the means to assist our small but important way to be stewards of our environment and reduce the amount of waste that we send to the landfill. We hope the Council will assist us in granting the funds for this project. Thank you for considering our request. We look forward to your response.
