Appendix 2: Mandatory Masking timeline:

August 31, 2020

At its August 31, 2020 Regular Business Meeting, City Council considered an Administrative report titled, "<u>The Use of Non-Medical Face Masks and Public Access</u> to City Services" and resolved that:

- All users of Saskatoon Transit services wear a non-medical face mask; and
- All persons accessing all City operated facilities and indoor City of Saskatoon services wear a non-medical face mask.

November 6, 2020 and November 19, 2020

The Government of Saskatchewan issued a <u>Public Health Order</u> mandating mask use in indoor public spaces in Saskatoon, Regina, and Prince Albert effective November 6, 2020. A <u>Public Health Order</u> requiring masks in all indoor spaces in Saskatchewan came into effect on November 19, 2020.

July 11, 2021

On July 11, 2021, the Government of Saskatchewan entered Step Three of the Re-Opening Roadmap and all public health orders related to COVID-19 were lifted, including the public health order requiring masking in indoor spaces. The City similarly lifted its requirements for staff and the public to mask in City Facilities and on Saskatoon Transit on July 11. Masking continued to be an option for all residents who wished to do so.

August 30, 2021

At its <u>August 30, 2021 Regular Business Meeting</u>, City Council resolved that non-medical face masks would be required in all City Facilities and on Saskatoon Transit effective September 1, 2021.

September 17, 2021

The Government of Saskatchewan implemented a <u>Public Health Order</u> requiring mandatory masking for all indoor public spaces on September 17, 2021.
