 - one son Bill Williams


In 1935, due to drought conditions, the property was surrendered to the municipality for taxes owing - a copy of the auction sale bill is enclosed.

The property was located in the Cormoran Park municipality until the City of Saskatoon purchased it.

The Craig family home was eventually moved to Central Avenue in the community of Sutherland, Saskatoon and it remains there to this day.
