McPherson Avenue in Saskatoon was named after David Lewis MacPherson, whose "egregious colonial policy decisions" against local Métis people was one of the leading catalysts of the North West Rebellion.

The name should be changed to honour renowned fiddler and Order of Canada medalist, John Arcand, whose annual FiddleFest is a significant part of Saskatoon tourism.
