I am writing to encourage council to think very hard about implementing more red tape and additional permitting processes for projects in the core of our city. If the city's goal is higher density and more people living in the core, the city should be making it easier and more attractive for builders and developers to create dense multi-family projects here. Density requires maximizing site coverage and if city trees are encroaching on private property, the city should take more responsibility for solving this encroachment issue... the same way property owners are required to maintain trees on their own property and ensure they do not encroach or adversely affect their neighbour's property. Adding more permits to an already challenging process will encourage me to focus on greenfield developments outside of the core.
