## Comments:

We decry the loss of habitat when other countries have a disaster if some sort, i.e., wildfires in Australia, South America, whilst we inflict wanton destruction on our own. The swales are home to many at risk species (including both flora and fauna), and must be protected at all cost. We can do something about this while we are still able, rather than, as an afterthought, mourn these losses when it's too late.
