The protection of the increasingly rare sharp tail grouse dancing grounds and 2. The protection of the all important land and habitat linkages between the N.E. Swale and the small Swale, as well as the N.E. Swale and the River. Providing Linkages are fundamental to overall ecological integrity. It was pleasing to read that the third proposal did allow for some small added acreage.

In conservation if we compromise one component of an ecosystem of high ecological integrity, we compromise the entire ecosystem.

It is with this understanding that I strongly recommend that council agrees to accept the Swale Watchers proposal.
