Comments:

I'm writing to comment on the proposals for the Swale boundaries.

Option #3 is the best of the three options proposed for the Swale area, but it leaves a lot to be desired. It could be improved by providing a habitat corridor between the Northeast Swale and the river valley, and between the

Northeast Swale and Small Swale. It can also be improved by providing better protection of the sharp-tailed grouse dancing grounds and the hydrologically sensitive Small Swale wetlands.

I have visited cities that are larger and more densely populated than Saskatoon that show a much better vision for the protection of natural areas. There's no reason Saskatoon can't do better. It's important for wildlife conservation. And it's also important for making Saskatoon a more liveable place, which is vital for Saskatoon's economic future. Thank you for considering my comments,
