ISSUE

This report submits Bylaw No. 9914, *The Waste Amendment Bylaw, 2023 (No. 2)* ("Bylaw") for City Council's consideration.

RECOMMENDATION

That City Council consider Bylaw No. 9914, The Waste Amendment Bylaw, 2023 (No. 2).

BACKGROUND

At its <u>June 28, 2023 Regular Business Meeting</u>, City Council considered a report of the General Manager, Utilities and Environment dated June 6, 2023, and resolved:

That the City Solicitor bring forward to City Council the necessary amendments to Bylaw No. 9844 amendments and rate structure changes, identified in the report of the Utilities and Environment Division dated June 6, 2023.

DISCUSSION/ANALYSIS

In accordance with City Council's instructions, we are pleased to submit Bylaw No. 9914, *The Waste Amendment Bylaw, 2023 (No. 2),* for City Council's consideration.

As housekeeping amendments, the Bylaw clarifies how fees for recyclable and organic material collection services are charged to residents, and a new definition for "clean soil" has been added to Schedule "F". Schedule "F" has also been amended to include "recyclable materials" as an item that is free to dispose of at the Waste Management Centre.
