
# Hello,

In response to the small note available at the door of St. Mary's on Sunday asking, "Do you feel having a fence around the church property is important?" I am attaching my original email to Father Kevin with my comments regarding the announcement that a fence would be put up. Since then I am sure you are aware that a correction had to be issued, with reference to the original announcement, due to incorrect information about support by local "Community partners".

With regards to this latest request for comment I would offer the following:


1. This request seems too little too late. I would think many people would say, 'what is the point of asking this now, the fence is already up?' So the likelihood of getting a good cross section of opinion is probably not going to happen.

2. The fence seems to have not achieved its purpose. I am attaching photos which show, a) A hole having been cut in the fence for access b) Trash still being thrown inside the fence (protests perhaps??), c) drug paraphernalia still on the steps of the hall side door (2 photos). I have also seen sleeping materials at that same spot, which means people are jumping the fence to get access to this area. So unless some razor wire is going to be added to the top of the fence, it will probably continue. c) Trash in the alleyway between the church and rectory at an all time high! (another protest??) d) And the best of all: A "No Loitering" sign posted! Does anyone seriously believe this is going to have any effect on the folks around there? Or is an enforcement officer going to be hired?



So to answer the question posed: I **do not** think it is important to have a fence around the church property. While I do not live in the area I am around there very often and I have never felt threatened. I also have been told by many of our indigenous parishioners and even some of St. Mary's parishioners, that the fence has set the relationship between indigenous and non-indigenous back a hundred years.

Father McGee,

Father Graham forwarded me your letter regarding the fencing of St. Mary's Property. I want to let you know my "strong feelings" of opposition to this action.

It may not be your intention, however "Fort" St. Mary's will clearly communicate separation and protection from those who live on the streets in the neighbourhood. Not a very welcoming sign. Perhaps a better initial approach may have been to talk with your community partners, like Prairie Harm and West Side Clinic, to organize community groups

to regularly clean up the area, offering proper instruction on how to deal with hazardous waste, cast-off needles, etc. Also making available secure sharps containers around the outside of the partner buildings would be a good idea I suspect a fence will really not solve the problem because garbage and needles will likely be thrown over the fence or pushed through the links (as they are now), possibly in protest. Also, an 8-foot fence may very likely be in contravention with City of Saskatoon bylaws regarding fence heights. You may have to deal with bylaw enforcement complaints.

I agree with you that the issue of homelessness "needs a more robust response than what St Mary's Parish can provide alone". However, St. Mary's parishioners could be a force for change, if they so desired. They are influential people and should they offer an organized approach to the City and the Provincial governments I suspect there would be positive change

I look forward to seeing how St. Mary's is going to make this action appear to create greater options of how it can be a positive presence in the neighbourhood

Hi St. Mary's,

I believe that having a fince, high enough to be a deterrent, is of critical importance in our neighborhood at the moment.

While I believe that as a church, we need to be connected to the challenges of our area, I also fiirmly belive that this work cannot be accomplished if we are always concerned with security for the parish. Having the current high chain link fence allows us to dedicate our limited time to activities of the church and neighborhood outreach, such as the hamper program.

Having a non-effective 1 meter high fence would, in my opinion, result in the following:

- a) Encourage camping, drug use, and associated activites on church property.
- b) Discourage parishioners from attending church events.
- c) Discourage volunteers coming out for activities such as the neighborhood hamper program.
- d) Tie up our very limited resources in clean-up, safety, and security activities.
- e) Tie up city resources such as police and other workers in responding to calls for assistance at our parish.
- f) Encourage criminals to use St. Mary's grounds to hide illegal activities, such as the sale of illegal drugs.

Do not allow the small measure of security we currently possess be stripped away. In this neighborhood's present state, the fence around St. Mary's actually allows us to reach out to those outside of it

### To Whom it May Concern:

We understand that the City of Saskatoon is asking why or why not having a fence around the church [St. Mary's Catholic Church] is important.

We would like to **express our support** to having this fence around church property for the simple reasons that, unfortunately and as sadly as it is the number of people that circulate around the church appear to not only be homeless, but severely under the influence of alcohol and illicit drugs. Even before the pandemic, there would be impaired people that walked in the middle of mass, yelling obscenities at the priest celebrating mass, causing significant disturbances during mass. Also, we witnessed and encounter many times upon arriving at church as early as 3:00 o'clock [to get ready for our choir] groups of 5 to 6 people injecting themselves right by the side door, impeding our entering the church premises; one cannot reason with people under the influence, particularly on hard drugs. Used needles were left thrown carelessly on the ground. Many would also gather in the front steps doing the same thing, injecting, carrying and displaying their belongings, which were/are evidently unsanitary. We have lots of children that attend our church that, sadly, have to bear witness to these unsavory situations.

Erecting the fence appears to be the last option for the church to protect not only its property, but also the faithful that attend church. Now we do see encampments erected around the back alley by the parking lot behind the church. The solution to this serious issue of the amount of homeless people lies on very different solutions, than to let them feel free to inject themselves wherever they please, leaving used needles, obviously infected, around the church or anywhere for that matter.
