BACKGROUND

Appointments are made in accordance with <u>Policy C01-003 Appointments to Civic Boards</u>, <u>Commissions</u>, <u>Authorities</u>, <u>and Committees</u>.

For the 2024 recruitment cycle, the call for applications began on September 9 with an initial deadline of September 29, which was extended to October 6. To create awareness for the City of Saskatoon's 2024 call for applications/recruitment of new board, committee and commission members, dedicated communication support occurred from September 9 – October 6, 2023 and included:

- Paid and organic social media posts across all City channels Facebook, X (Twitter), Instagram

Applications were considered by the City Agency Recruitment and Evaluation Committee (CARE) in October with recommendations being made to the Governance & Priorities Committee in November. City Council formalizes appointments for Advisory Committees at its November 22, 2023 Regular Business meeting.

DISCUSSION/ANALYSIS

The Municipal Heritage Advisory Committee has a number of agency (re)appointments and four citizen representative vacancies. Current membership status is outlined in Appendix 2.
