

## **2024 Appointments – Council Representatives – Centennial Auditorium and Convention Centre Corporation Board of Directors and Centennial Auditorium Foundation Board of Directors (TCU Place)**

### **ISSUE**

City Council annually makes (re)appointments of Council members to the Centennial Auditorium and Convention Centre Board of Directors and the Saskatoon Centennial Auditorium Foundation Board of Directors.

### **RECOMMENDATION**

That the Governance & Priorities Committee recommend to City Council that that the City's representative be instructed to vote the City's proxy at the 2024 Annual General Meeting for the reappointment of Councillors Kirton and Loewen to the Centennial Auditorium and Convention Centre Board of Directors and the Saskatoon Centennial Auditorium Foundation Board of Directors throughout a term expiring at the conclusion of the 2025 Annual General Meeting.

### **BACKGROUND**

Pursuant to its authority under *The Cities Act*, City Council has established a number of Controlled Corporations incorporated under *The Non-Profit Corporations Act, 1995* and now continued under *The Non-Profit Corporations Act, 2022* (NPCA).

In general, the Board of Directors consist of appointed Council member(s) and several volunteer citizens-at-large appointed by City Council, in accordance with [Policy C01-003 Appointments to Civic Boards, Commissions, Authorities, and Committees](#).

### **DISCUSSION/ANALYSIS**

TCU Place is a controlled corporation. City Council, at its meeting held on November 18, 2019, resolved that the Boards of Directors of controlled corporations set a range for board size of 6 to 15 Directors and that two City Councillors be appointed to the board of each of the controlled corporations. The TCU Place Board of Directors currently is comprised of two Councillors and 11 citizens-at-large.

Members of the TCU Place Board of Directors are also appointed to the Saskatoon Centennial Auditorium Foundation Board of Directors.

City Council considers council representative appointments for statutory boards and controlled corporations at its November 22, 2023 Regular Business meeting and the general public appointments at its December 20, 2023 Regular Business meeting.

Current membership status is outlined in Appendix 1.

**FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS**

There are no financial implications for the appointments and no remuneration is paid.

**OTHER IMPLICATIONS**

There are no privacy, legal, social, or environmental implications identified.

**NEXT STEPS**

The Governance and Priorities Committee will make its recommendations of Council representative appointments to City Council at the November 22, 2023 Regular Business Meeting.

The Committee will make its recommendations of general public appointments to City Council at its December 20, 2023 Regular Business meeting.
