

2024 Appointments – City Mortgage Appeal Board (CMAB) and Access Transit Appeal Board (ATAB)

ISSUE

City Council makes annual appointments to its various Boards and Committees. Appointees to the CMAB shall also serve as a member of the ATAB. There are currently three citizen representative vacancies.

RECOMMENDATION

That the Governance & Priorities recommend to City Council that the following be appointed to the City Mortgage Appeal Board and Access Transit Appeal Board, effective immediately to the end of 2024:

1. Kojo Anaman, citizen representative
2. Joshua Delainey, citizen representative
3. Om Kochar, citizen representative

BACKGROUND

Appointments are made in accordance with [Policy C01-003 Appointments to Civic Boards, Commissions, Authorities, and Committees](#).

For the 2024 recruitment cycle, advertising occurred from September 9 – 29, 2023. Advertising was placed in the local press on September 9 and on the City's website and through the City's social media channels throughout the duration. Recruitment information was also provided to various agencies. The deadline for applications was September 29 and was extended to October 6.

Applications as in Appendices 4 and 5 were considered by the City Agency Recruitment and Evaluation Committee (CARE) in October with recommendations being made to the Governance & Priorities Committee. City Council considers appointments for Advisory Committees at its November 22, 2023 Regular Business meeting.

DISCUSSION/ANALYSIS

The Terms of Reference for these appeal boards are provided as Appendix 1.

There are currently three vacancies on the boards. Current membership status provided in Appendix 2.

There were four applications received. A 2024 current list of applicants is provided as Appendix 3.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

There are no financial implications for the appointments as all members serving are volunteers and no remuneration is paid. There are costs for advertising which is included in the City Clerk’s Office operating budget annually.
