Pre-Construction

- Complete an extensive in-house pedestrian and cyclist traffic audit of daily use at peak hours.
- 2. Calibrate **transit services** to align with typical work hours and "off hours" shifts



During and Post-Construction

- 1. A "business first" approach to implementation:
 - Provide direct, advanced notification (3 months) on key construction activities
 - Appoint a Business Liaison Officer with project authority directly accessible to business owners



During and Post-Construction

- Compensate businesses whose operations will be affected during the construction:
 - Provide a percentage-based tax incentive for business interruption during the construction
 - Pay fair market value for any land acquired for construction
 - Provide temporary parking locations and compensation for parking stalls lost



During and Post-Construction

 Provide adequate signage directing traffic to access points for affected businesses
