Dear Mayor and City Councillors,

I am writing in support of Bylaw No. 9957, *The Tree Protection Bylaw* which offers increased protection for our City trees.

I have lived in the Haultain neighbourhood, which is part of Ward 6, for a number of years. Haultain is an older neighbourhood containing many mature trees and is also a neighbourhood where infill development, involving the demolition of older homes and construction of new ones, is taking place. I am happy to see that this new bylaw and guidelines will provide more protection for the trees in this neighbourhood, as well as for trees throughout the city.
