To Saskatoon City Council,

I cycle through the College Drive and Wiggins Avenue intersection twice daily as part of my commute, and I would like to see it made safer for vulnerable road users, including myself. Therefore, I am writing to voice my support for the motion that the Administration continue with implementation of recommendations 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 11, 12, 13, and 14 from the Road Safety Audit. Additionally, I encourage council to implement recommendations 9 and 10 once the issues surrounding transit negotiations and staffing resources are resolved. I also ask that the defeat of recommendation 8 be reconsidered. College and Wiggins would not be the only intersection in the city where a right turn on red is not allowed, and with proper clear signage drivers will be able to respect the nature of the intersection. After Natasha Fox's death last summer, a line of paint appeared on both sides of Wiggins for a block, and I noticed a marked difference in how drivers behaved; for the first time, I felt like there was actually space being made for me on the road there. More awareness of cyclists near this intersection can only make it safer.
