Dear Mayor Clark & City Council,

I am so glad that the City has planned for more housing units under the Housing Accelerator Fund and I support the changes to zoning to allow for more four storey units close to transit corridors, six storey units on transit corridors, and four units of housing on 50-foot lots.

My partner and I live in a four-storey condo building just off 8th Street and there are several other four storey buildings in our surrounding area, including a mix of affordable rental housing and condo developments ranging in age and cost. I love the density and diversity of our neighbourhood. I love watching my neighbours play cricket at night in the park, and as a longtime transit user, I love seeing growing ridership on buses in my neighborhood. I also love that my neighbourhood is quite safe because there are almost always people around, due to the density. After all, safer neighborhoods are busy, active neighbourhoods.

In my work in the field of peer support for mental health and addiction challenges, I am worried about increasing inequality and houselessness and the impacts this has on people's wellness. It is almost impossible to get well and stay well without adequate housing, and our city has extremely low vacancy rates currently, forcing more and more people into shelters or the streets. We need a strong and concerted plan to increase the availability of low-income housing options. These zoning changes are the step we need now in this city. Please support the zoning changes in your upcoming vote.
