I want to express my full support for the zoning changes being proposed for the Housing Action Plan. The reason I support this change is because Saskatoon is a fast-growing city that is currently not providing enough homes to the residents of the city and the sprawling that is currently seen through development is not sustainable. Sprawling is not sustainable in an environmental perspective as the further we sprawl the more Native Prairie Grasslands are impacted; Saskatchewan has one of the most endangered ecosystems in the world, with about 9% of our Native Prairie Grasslands left. Urban sprawling into the North East Swale (and other natural areas around the city) is directly building into those endangered zones; through urban sprawling we are also filling in valuable wetlands that are needed for our migrating birds (examples in Evergreen and Brighton's neighbourhood - these were originally Native Prairie Grasslands and wetlands). Urban sprawling is causing an extreme loss of our valuable Native Prairie Grasslands and wetlands).

The solution? Building up and making current neighbourhoods more dense. The urbanization sprawl needs to stop. We are directly impacting the natural ecosystem and all organisms who call those environments home. To live in harmony with the environment, we must stop destroying it for our use. These native spaces are much more valuable than urbanization's sprawl. We must protect the land in this way.
