

## Feeding of Wildlife Bylaws in Other Jurisdictions

City	Feeding of Wildlife Bylaw	Provincial Status
<b>Saskatoon</b>	No bylaw	Broad dangerous animal feeding prohibition
<b>Regina</b>	No bylaw	
<b>Vancouver</b>	Prohibition to feed all wildlife- bylaw states that no person can feed or attempt to feed wildlife or place any food or food waste in a manner that attracts or could attract wildlife	Broad dangerous animal feeding prohibition
<b>Calgary</b>	Community Standards Bylaw that restricts attractants for wildlife	Targeted legislation – illegal to feed wildlife in provincial parks or recreation areas – allowing municipalities to make laws of their own
<b>Edmonton</b>	In Edmonton, the intentional feeding of wildlife and excessive accumulation of edible materials on private and personal property is prohibited under the Community Standards Bylaw 14600, the Public Places Bylaw 14614 and the Parkland Bylaw 2202	
<b>Winnipeg</b>	In 2022, Winnipeg amended the Responsible Pet Ownership Bylaw to prohibit the intentional feeding of all wildlife, with the exception of birds, trapping, animal rescue or for research purposes	Targeted legislation – In Manitoba in 2015, the Province passed legislation making it illegal to feed wildlife along provincial roads and highways, however, the ban did not apply to municipal roads
