



# 2025 Annual Combined Traffic Services Saskatchewan Report



## Overview

### 2025 Annual Summary (10 SPS members):

Combined Traffic Services Saskatchewan (CTSS) is a multi-agency police partnership between the Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP) and six Saskatchewan municipal police agencies (Saskatoon Police Service, Weyburn Police Service, Estevan Police Service, Prince Albert Police Service, Moose Jaw Police Service, Regina Police Service), involving 120 police officer positions across 17 locations in Saskatchewan. Together, the program aims to reduce the number of fatal and serious traffic collisions that occur on Saskatchewan roadways by raising public awareness and conducting traffic enforcement regarding The Big Four areas of concern outlined on the Canadian Council of Motor Transport Administrators (CCMTA) Canada's Road Safety Strategy:

- 1) Impaired Driving;
- 2) Distracted Driving;
- 3) Seatbelts, and;
- 4) Speeding.

Traffic safety encompasses a variety of monitoring and enforcement action, including but not limited to the following items:

Summary Offence Tickets are issued for non-criminal violations of acts such as the Traffic Safety Act, Vehicle Equipment Regulations or municipal bylaws. They represent minor infractions where no significant harm or injury occurred.



## Activity in Saskatoon

In 2025, SPS CTSS issued 3,277 Summary Offence Tickets within Saskatoon representing 23% of their CTSS SOTs.

### Special Projects

CTSS members participated in a number of joint traffic project initiatives in 2025 with our partner agencies including the RCMP, Corman Park Police Service, Dalmeny Police Service, University of Saskatchewan Protective Services, Saskatchewan Highway Patrol, SGI, and the Saskatoon Police Service Traffic Unit. Large scale, multi-agency check stops were held in Chamberlain, Langham, Swift Current, and Marshall, Saskatchewan.

On July 8, 2025, a Saskatoon Police Service CTSS member was conducting speed enforcement on Valley Road. Along with members from the Corman Park and Vanscoy Police Service, a traffic stop was initiated on a vehicle that did not have a license plate. Further investigation revealed that the occupants were in possession of a number of stolen drivers' licenses, birth certificates, treaty cards, forged cheques, and forged documents. Numerous drugs and drug paraphernalia were also located inside the vehicle.

A 42-year-old male was arrested and charged with 17 Criminal Code violations including, identity theft, fraud, forgery, possession of methamphetamine and cocaine, and breach of release conditions. In addition to these charges, he was also arrested on a number of outstanding warrants.

The driver, a 33-year-old male, was issued three tickets related to the traffic stop, and the vehicle was impounded for 60 days.



On November 14, 2025, Saskatoon Police Service CTSS members participated in a joint agency check-stop involving twenty-three police officers, from four agencies, at the Langham weigh scale on Highway 16, near Saskatoon. At the check-stop, officers inspected a trailer and discovered 24 pallets of unstamped tobacco products. In total, 9.3 million illegal cigarettes were seized, and the operator of the commercial vehicle was charged with Criminal Code, Tobacco Tax Act, and Excise Act charges. An estimated \$4.4 million of tax dollars would have been evaded if this seizure did not take place.

These are two examples of the strong partnership, and collaborative enforcement efforts that our Saskatoon Police Service CTSS members are involved in throughout the year.
