## 9<sup>th</sup> Street Traffic Review Update and Survey

The City of Saskatoon undertook a Neighbourhood Traffic Review (NTR) in Nutana in 2014. The comprehensive review, which included gathering input from area residents and traffic analysis, resulted in a traffic improvement plan that was adopted by City Council on May 25, 2015. This plan, as well as more information about the NTR process, is available at saskatoon.ca/NTR.

The final plan included a number of traffic calming measures within the Nutana neighbourhood, including a directional closure at 9<sup>th</sup> Street & Idylwyld Drive / Lorne Avenue and removing the temporary roundabout at 9<sup>th</sup> Street & McPherson Avenue.

The directional closure at 9<sup>th</sup> Street & Idylwyld Drive / Lorne Avenue was installed temporarily in October 2015. Traffic calming measures are typically installed temporarily for a minimum of one year to evaluate their effectiveness. However, in this case, City Council voted to have the directional closure removed right away after hearing public concerns about the change.

In October 2017, Council requested that the matter of traffic safety for the 100 block of 9<sup>th</sup> Street be reviewed once again after hearing renewed concerns from area residents. As a result, City traffic engineers are once again undertaking a review of traffic along this section of 9<sup>th</sup> Street.

In addition to our own analysis of traffic patterns and speeds, we'd like to invite your feedback on this matter. Please provide us with your input on any traffic safety concerns along 9<sup>th</sup> Street by filling out the survey on the reverse side of this flyer.
