
Committee Referrals – Standing Policy Committee on Environment, Utilities and Corporate Services

Recommendation

That the item identified for removal from the referral list be approved.

Topic and Purpose

The purpose of this report is to update the Standing Policy Committee on Environment, Utilities & Corporate Services on its list of referrals and to recommend removal of one item.

Report Highlights

1. The City Clerk's Office maintains lists of referrals before City Council and its Committees.
2. As matters are dealt with or reported on, items are removed from the lists.
3. In order to resolve some older referrals that may not require a full report, the Administration has provided in this report its rationale for why each item could be considered resolved or no longer relevant. If Committee agrees, the matters will be removed from the list.

Report

Administration has undertaken a review of referrals for the Standing Policy Committee on Environment, Utilities and Corporate Services (Attachment 1). The list contains the subject matter, date of meeting, the Department the matter was referred to, resolution (or portion of) that was referred and the current status of each item, as provided by Administration. Administration is recommending that the following item on the list be removed. Rationale for removal is also included.

Saskatoon Indigenous Accord - Strengthening Relationships between the City of Saskatoon and Urban Indigenous Peoples (February 18, 2016)

City Administration met with Aboriginal Affairs Coalition of Saskatchewan (AACS) in 2016. Through this meeting, it was determined that the AACS represents a very limited cross-section of the aboriginal community, and that as a municipal government we need to represent all the urban aboriginal citizens. We need to recognize all aboriginal organizations and the jurisdictional mandates of their memberships. Administration has advised AACS to approach provincially mandated organizations regarding their request for an accord.

Options to the Recommendation

Committee may choose not to remove this item from the list.
