I am writing to ask you to take two actions:

(1) immediately renew the Saskatoon Farmers' Market 's lease, and

(2) review the City's aspirations for the market building, to remove the requirement for six-day-a-week activity.

The Saskatoon Farmers' Market is a huge success. Week after week, it creates community, builds health, reduces waste, encourages entrepreneurship and sustains small businesses. In all these ways, it supports the City's strategic goals of Quality of Life, Environmental Leadership and Economic Diversity.

By providing a home for Market, the City has earned a right to claim a share of the credit for these achievements.

But now, instead of supporting the Farmers' Market, the City seems poised to sabotage it. Seen from a narrowly commercial point of view, the Market has been found lacking because it does not – and logically cannot -- "animate" its premises six days a week. In this context, "animate" is another word for "monetize." Are we really prepared to sacrifice the unique value of our Farmers' Market to create ordinary retail space?

The Saskatoon Farmers' Market is special because it is exactly what it claims to be: a place where local producers and consumers meet and conduct business, face to face, twelve months of the year. Its only near-equivalent on the prairies (the only other Farmers' Market with a dedicated, year-round home) is the one-day-a-week Old Strathcona Farmers' Market in Edmonton—to my mind one of that city's major attractions. Here in Saskatoon, we have created something similarly remarkable and rare, yet we seem to be blind to our own achievement.
