- Off-leash dogs (Bylaw No. 7860);
- ATVs (Bylaw No. 7767);
- Snowmobiles (Bylaw No. 7767);
- Power driven vessel:
- Other motorized vehicles (except motorized devices emergency and service vehicles) (Bylaw No. 7767);
- Picking wildflowers (Bylaw No. 7767);
- Dumping (Bylaw No. 5713); and
- Littering (Bylaw No. 7767).
