Dear Mayor Charlie Clark and City Council members,

I am a very concerned citizen that spends a lot of time in the Broadway business area. The proposed designated rapid bus lanes has me wondering about its' practicality and its' impact on the Broadway business area.

To designate the two centre traffic lanes of the Broadway business area and leave the remaining lane for traffic flow would indeed really cramp the vehicular traffic. Finding parking on the street is already difficult; having to park and un-park would become even more difficult and problematic to traffic flow.

Also some businesses only have front access for inventory delivery, causing more traffic congestion.

There is a school zone at both ends of this designated area, making traffic slower in this lovely historical and locally owned business walkabout area.

What happens when there are street closures for the Street Fair, the Fringe and like events on the street?

Also, it appears that there would be no possibility for any left turns off of Broadway Avenue: is this true?

The construction time needed for rearranging the street lanes will take a great toll on the availability for shoppers to frequent the area. Businesses are still struggling from the lengthy but very necessary two summers needed to redo the water and sewer systems here. Some businesses are still struggling and at least two have disappeared as a result of lost revenue.

Also, I am wondering how the bridge traffic fits into this plan to keep the busses running on time. Will there be a need to designate North and South going lanes on the bridge to keep the busses flowing properly?

Would it not be possible, as well as more cost effective and community building, to have the BRT run down Broadway Avenue but not designate a special lane for the said

Also, what is the thought behind having heated waiting stalls if there is only a 10 minute wait between busses?

These are my concerns for the future of the Broadway Street area. I hope you, as our city government will receive my thoughts and concerns, before making such a major community and financial decision.



Dear Mayor Charlie Clark and City Council members,

I am a very concerned citizen that spends a lot of time in the Broadway business area working, eating, shopping and playing. The proposed designated rapid bus lanes has me wondering about its' practicality and its' impact on the Broadway business area. The Broadway 360 Development Plan was in 2009 with many great improvements to the area which contributes to why people want to spend time in this amazing heritage community and pedestrian friendly area.

To remove the recently updated boulevards including trees and the shelter they give and replace them with two centre traffic lanes of the Broadway business area and leave ONE remaining lane per direction for traffic flow would indeed really cramp the vehicular traffic. Parking in the Broadway area is already challenging; top it off with traffic halting when someone is trying to parallel park or a merchant is receiving an order as some businesses only have a front door.

There are TWO school zones; one at each end of the proposed 4 block designated lane area slowing all traffic to 30 km/h. No one is rushing through this lovely historical and locally owned business walkabout area. Why must there be designated bus lanes only? We could save so much money by leaving Broadway the way it is – DESIRABLE.

What happens when there are street closures for the Street Fair, the Fringe and like events on the street? Do we build a second station for 10 days of the year that Broadway has the street closed for events? At what cost? This is TAXPAYER'S money, not Monopoly money. Heating stations that the bus comes to every 10 minutes sounds expensive and perhaps unnecessary.

The construction time needed for rearranging the street lanes will take a great toll on the availability for shoppers to frequent the area. Businesses are still struggling from the too lengthy but very necessary two summers needed to redo the water and sewer systems here. Some businesses have even disappeared partially due to the lost revenue like Sushiro, Duck Duck Goose and the Travel Agency (800 block).

Please reconsider the route/aspects of this BRT:

1) First Avenue to Senator Sidney L. Buckwold Bridge to 8th Street (stop along 8th including Broadway).

REASONING - First Avenue has not been recently renovated like Third Avenue (how much \$\$ would they be destroying) AND I believe the Downtown BID would like this route as well from what I heard at the meeting on June 20/18.

2) If it must be on Broadway, NO DESIGNATED LANE please.

REASONING -The traffic should flow better now that the Traffic Bridge is open. Keep the Broadway area intact and undestroyed. We, the taxpayers, are footing the bill. People go to the Broadway area because it is the way it is, not a Bus super roadway. We love the ambience, shelter, character and pace of our desirable community.

These are my concerns for the future of the Broadway Corridor area. I hope you, as our city government will consider my thoughts and concerns, before making such a major community and financial decision.
