<b>Calgary, AB</b>	<b>Sustainable Environmental and Ethical Procurement Policy (SEPP)</b>
<p>“Procurement &amp; Warehousing provide procurement, inventory, and warehouse services to the City. We support the City by following public procurement law, trade agreements, and City policy. We support City businesses meeting operational commitments and community outcomes through the delivery of goods and services at appropriate quality and cost. <p>Excerpt from Social Procurement Policy:</p> <p>“<b>1.2.1</b> Purchasing and Materials Management Division will work with supplier certification organizations to obtain a list of diverse suppliers  <b>1.2.2</b> As part of the City’s Divisional Purchase Order Process, City divisions shall review the list obtained under  <b>1.2.1</b> and, where feasible, attempt to include at least one (1) quotation from a diverse supplier when undertaking the Divisional Purchase Order process.”</p>	
<b>London, ON</b>	<b>Procurement of Goods and Services Policy</b>
<p>Includes mission statement on "Sustainable Purchasing":</p> <p>“The City of London’s procurement objective to achieve best value for the City by considering the full life cycle of products and their complete economic, environmental and social costs and benefits.”</p>	
<b>Vancouver, BC</b>	<b>Procurement Policy</b>
<p>Includes definitions of "Social Enterprise", "Social Sustainability", and "Social Value".</p>	
<b>Saskatchewan Urban Municipalities Association (SUMA)</b>	<b>Truth and Reconciliation Policy</b>
<p>“SUMA Position Statement:</p> <p>Municipal governments have been called to take action in promoting reconciliation. SUMA encourages urban governments to engage in reconciliation, and calls on the federal and provincial governments to commit to work, in conjunction with Indigenous organizations, to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• create new tools to encourage regional cooperation between urban municipalities, rural municipalities, and First Nations;</li> <li>• develop materials on fostering economic development between urban municipalities, rural municipalities, and First Nations; and</li> <li>• work on information to provide guidance on creating urban reserves, and best practices.”</li> </ul>
