
Amendment to Bylaw 7200, The Traffic Bylaw – 72-Hour, On-Street Parking & Update to Pick Up and Delivery and Long Haul Truck Routes

Recommendation

That City Council consider Bylaw No. 9572, *The Traffic Amendment Bylaw, 2019*.

Topic and Purpose

The purpose of this report is to provide City Council with Bylaw No. 9572, *The Traffic Amendment Bylaw, 2019*, which implements City Council's decision to amend Bylaw No. 7200, *The Traffic Bylaw* to:

- (a) implement a city-wide, 72-hour, on-street parking restriction from the current 36 hours, leaving the current notice period of 36 hours in place; and
- (b) to update the pickup and delivery and long haul truck route schedules to include Chief Mistawasis Bridge and associated roads.

Report

At its Regular Business Meeting on February 25, 2019, City Council considered two reports dated February 11, 2019, from the Transportation & Construction Department recommending approval of proposed amendments to Bylaw No. 7200, *The Traffic Bylaw* to implement a city-wide, 72-hour, on-street parking restriction from the current 36 hours, leaving the current notice period of 36 hours in place and also to include Chief Mistawasis Bridge and associated roads on Schedule No. 8 "Pick Up and Delivery Vehicle Routes" and Schedule 8a "Long Haul Vehicle Routes".

City Council approved the proposed amendments, and directed the City Solicitor to prepare the necessary bylaw amendment.

In addition, a housekeeping amendment has become necessary to Schedule No. 10 of the Bylaw to allow for the appointment of Bylaw Enforcement Officers by the General Manager.

In accordance with City Council's instructions, we are pleased to submit Bylaw No. 9572, *The Traffic Amendment Bylaw, 2019* for City Council's consideration.
