Regina	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • No boulevard leases in place. • Would not enter into a boulevard lease. • Would only consider selling an area at the back of a property, where it does not impact any other properties nor create any kind of precedent. • No policy / bylaw. Views it as 'boulevard is public property managed by the City of Regina so it cannot be used for private use.'
Edmonton	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Fences on boulevards are not allowed as per their Traffic Bylaw. • No boulevard leases in place. • Would not enter into a boulevard lease. • No policy / bylaw allowing ROW boulevard leases.
Calgary	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Residents are permitted to build an enclosed fence 0.3 meters (~1 foot) in the boulevard without getting permission. Intent is that this covers off accidental fence placement into a boulevard but if exceeds the 0.3m, has to be moved. • No boulevard leases in place. • No policy / bylaw allowing ROW boulevard leases.
Winnipeg	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • No residential leases of boulevard ROW. • Do have commercial leases of boulevard ROW. • Residential encroachments of up to 6" into the public ROW are permitted.
